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RESPITE SERVICES

These services are provided for seniors to get time away from caregiving responsibilities. This gives caregivers time to take a break while children are participating in afterschool care, camps or extracurricular activities.



WHO QUALIFIES?

You may qualify to receive free respite services if you are:

- A grandparent or other relative (not birth or adoptive parents) 55 years of age or older who is providing care to children under the age of 18.
- A grandparent or other relative 55 years of age or older who is providing care to an adult age 18-59 with disabilities.

- In total, 170,000 North Carolina children (7%) under age 18 live in grandparentheaded households. Forty-five percent of children living in grandparent-headed households are under 6 years old, 30% are between the ages of 6 and 11, and 25% are ages 12-17.
- These grandparents have been responsible for the care of their grandchildren for years. 40% have been providing for their grandchildren for 5 or more years, and an additional 40% have been responsible for the care of their grandchildren for 1 to 4 years.
